## SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

## **SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE**

#### 7.1 HANDLING

Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. Wash exposed areas thoroughly with soap and water. Avoid breathing of vapors. Keep out of the reach of children. Avoid breathing of dust created by cutting, sanding, grinding or machining. Avoid contact with oxidizing agents.
